Hiring Criteria

In order to promote excellence in our French programs, the Lakehead District School Board (LDSB) and the Thunder Bay Catholic District School Board (TBCDSB) have agreed to specific criteria for hiring French teachers in each of their boards. The criteria are different for each program offered (French Immersion or Core French). In both cases, appropriate DELF or DALF certification obtained from an accredited DELF-DALF centre, within the last four years, is required.

DELF-DALF for Everyone (Tout public) exams are held two or three times a year depending on the centre. The Northwest Ontario DELF-DALF Centre will be offering two sessions each year, one in the fall and one in early spring.

French Immersion Program

A DALF C1 certificate with an overall average of 50%, with a minimum of 50% in two competencies:

- Oral Production 50%
- Written Production 50%

Core French Program

A DELF B2 certificate with an overall average of 70%, with a minimum of 70% in each of the four competencies:

- Oral Comprehension 70%
- Written Comprehension 70%
- Oral Production 70%
- Written Production 70%
