A high school credit program

The Thunder Bay District Health Unit coordinates the pre-natal program geared to teens. After a student delivers her baby, she continues her studies using facilities present in the room to care for her infant. Upon completion of the semester, the student is encouraged to re-enter her home school. However, if the student prefers to remain in the program, she is then transferred to the MISOL program where daycare may be provided by the Thunder Bay District Social Services

Administration Board. Daycare is provided for infants and children on a limited basis to students who meet the requirements.
