RE: 2013-2014 PRELIMINARY BUDGET

1. <u>Background</u>

- 1.1 On an annual basis, the Ministry of Education requires school boards in Ontario to submit a budget in accordance with Grants for Student Needs legislation.
- 1.2 The funding regulation for the 2013-2014 fiscal year was released by the Ministry of Education on March 27, 2013. Although the grants announced provincially were fairly consistent with last year, showing only a slight decrease per pupil, the budgeting process has been difficult as Lakehead District School Board continues to be a declining enrolment board. Budget submissions are due to the Ministry by June 28, 2013.

2. Situation

Administration is concluding its preparation of the 2013-2014 budget as outlined in Appendix A, "2013-2014 Revenues", and Appendix B, "2013-2014 Expenditure Summary" and is presenting it for Trustees input and consideration.
