TO THE CHAIR AND MEMBERS OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE – Public Session

RE: <u>2014-2015 PRELIMINARY BUDGET</u>

1. <u>Background</u>

- 1.1 On an annual basis, the Ministry of Education requires school boards in Ontario to submit a budget in accordance with Grants for Student Needs legislation (GSNs).
- 1.2 The funding regulation for the 2014-2015 fiscal year was released by the Ministry of Education on March 27, 2014. While the budget announcement showed a slight overall increase in projected per pupil funding, the increase includes the incorporation of Full Day Kindergarten in the GSNs, Elementary Teachers' Federation of Ontario 2% salary increase, and benchmark adjustments to reflect the anticipated cost of the new sick leave plan.
- 1.3 The budgeting process has been more difficult this year than in recent memory. The Board continues to decline in enrolment system wide, but particularly in the secondary panel the decline remains significant.
- 1.4 Budget submissions are due to the Ministry by June 30, 2014.

2. <u>Situation</u>

Administration is concluding its preparation of the 2014-2015 budget as outlined in Appendix A, "2014-2015 Revenues", and Appendix B, "2014-2015 Expenditure Summary" and is presenting it for Trustees input and consideration.
