## RE: THE ARTS

## 1. <u>Background</u>

- 1.1 As identified in the Strategic Plan, Lakehead District School Board seeks high levels of personal and academic excellence for every student. "The arts offer students unique opportunities to engage in imaginative and innovative thought and action and to develop the ability to communicate and represent their thoughts, feelings, and ideas in numerous ways.
- 1.2 Lakehead District School Board continues to provide high quality programs and professional learning in the arts to enhance student outcomes and support teacher learning.

## 2. Situation

- 2.1 A continued focus on supporting both teacher and student learning in music, Kindergarten through Grade 8, is being achieved through ongoing partnerships with:
  - Thunder Bay Symphony Orchestra (TBSO); and
  - Learning Through the Arts.
- 2.2 Lakehead District School Board's unique collaboration with the Royal Conservatory of Music's program, Learning Through the Arts (LTTA) continues to provide innovative learning for students and teachers in all areas of the Arts Dance, Drama, Music and Visual Arts.

## 3. Program Overview

- 3.1 Working with the Thunder Bay Symphony Orchestra continues to provide a number of unique learning experiences for both teachers and students, including:
  - Grade 3 Symphony Sing-Along;
  - TBSO in the schools;
  - Carnegie Hall Link Up Program; and
  - Grade 5 Musicians in the Classroom.

- 3.2 Following very successful pilot programs during the 2013-2014 school year, Royal Conservatory's LTTA continues to offer unique and specialized professional learning for Kindergarten to Grade 8 teachers through programs designed jointly by Lakehead District School Board and the Royal Conservatory LTTA Regional Manager. These programs include:
  - Media Broadcasting Arts in partnership with LU Radio;
  - Cultural Artist and Elder program; and
  - Itinerant Music Teacher Learning Labs.
- 3.3 Student dance, music and visual artists from Lakehead District School Board were recently celebrated at a two day regional Ministry training session. The professional learning session was enhanced by the student artwork displays, dance and music performances from a number of Lakehead District School Board elementary and secondary schools.
- 3.4 Along with public performances, relationships within each family of schools continues to provide opportunities for elementary students to be exposed to the broad range of experiences available in the Arts at a secondary level.
- 3.5 Across all four of our secondary schools a breadth of programming continues to be offered in the Arts. Band, strings, guitar and vocal music, drama and dance are offered across the four schools.

## 4. <u>Conclusion</u>

"The arts broaden young minds and exalt our spirits; they help us understand what it is that makes us human by validating our commonalities and celebrating our differences." Lakehead District School Board continues to provide unique opportunities for students to enhance their lives through a range of experiences in the arts.

## RE: <u>BY-LAW No. 111 – LONG-TERM FINANCING AGREEMENT</u>

### 1. Background

- 1.1 In September, 2009, Lakehead District School Board amalgamated with Collins District School Area Board.
- 1.2 Upon taking over operations of Bernier Stokes School, an asset condition survey was performed. The results of the survey report showed contaminated soil due to leaking fuel that would need to be remediated.
- 1.3 In April, 2011, the Ministry of Education approved funding up to \$500,000 for the soil remediation.
- 1.4 Over the months of July and August, 2013, after much consultation with the Ministry of the Environment, and with the assistance of an environmental consultant, the contamination was remediated at a cost of \$374,698.

#### 2. Situation

- 2.1 The Ministry of Education is financing the cost of the Bernier Stokes School remediation through the Ontario Financing Authority (OFA).
- 2.2 The OFA will provide a 25 year amortization period at the rate of 2.993%. The first semi-annual payment is due May 15, 2015. The final payment date is March 9, 2040.
- 2.3 Pending a grant regulation update, the Board will receive capital grant payments from the Ministry to cover all interest and principal payments associated with this long-term financing.

## **RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that Lakehead District School Board approve By-law No. 111 (Appendix A) authorizing the long-term financing agreement with the Ontario Financing Authority for the Bernier Stokes School soil remediation project, as outlined in Report No. 025-15.

#### **Lakehead District School Board**

#### **BY-LAW NUMBER 111**

A by-law to authorize a loan from the Ontario Financing Authority in the principal amount of \$374,698.00 pursuant to a loan agreement under section 7 of Ontario Regulation 41/10

**WHEREAS** subsection 247 (1) of the *Education Act* R.S.O. 1990, c. E.2, as amended (the "*Education Act*") and the regulations made thereunder, provides that, subject to any other provision of the *Education Act* and, specifically, the regulations made under subsection 247 (3) of the *Education Act*, a district school board may by by-law borrow money or incur debt for permanent improvements and may issue or execute any instrument prescribed under clause 247 (3) (f) of the *Education Act* in respect of the money borrowed or the debt incurred;

**AND WHEREAS** section 7 of Ontario Regulation 41/10 (the "Regulation"), provides that (1) a board may by by-law borrow money for permanent improvements by way of a loan with an initial maturity of more than one year from the Ontario Financing Authority and that (2) a board that obtains a loan described in section 7 of the Regulation shall ensure that the proceeds of it are used for permanent improvements;

**AND WHEREAS** the Lakehead District School Board, which under the *Education Act* constitutes a district school board (the "Board"), has undertaken capital projects under the Consolidated Capital Programs (the "CC Program") with respect to various capital projects for the Board, some of which projects are described in Schedule "A-2" attached to the Loan Agreement, as hereinafter defined (individually a "CC Eligible Project", collectively the "CC Eligible Projects") and each CC Eligible Project constitutes a "permanent improvement" as defined in subsection 1(1) of the *Education Act*. In the event that the Board will borrow the principal amount specified in paragraph 2.1 under the said Loan Agreement in respect of a single CC Eligible Project, the term "CC Eligible Projects" means that CC Eligible Project;

**AND WHEREAS** the CC Eligible Projects are collectively referred to as the "Eligible Projects". In the event that the Board will borrow the principal amount specified in paragraph 2.1 under the said Loan Agreement in respect of a single Eligible Project, the term "Eligible Projects" means that Eligible Project. The CC Program is referred to as the "Programs". In the event that the Board will borrow the principal amount specified in paragraph 2.1 under the said Loan Agreement in respect of a single Program, the term "Programs" means that Program;

**AND WHEREAS** the Board has in part financed the Eligible Projects by way of temporary borrowing from a financial institution or from a restricted purpose revenue account (formerly referred to as a reserve account or a reserve fund account) of the Board and the Board intends to borrow money from the Ontario Financing Authority for the purpose of financing the Eligible Projects on a long-term basis, and in this connection the Board intends to borrow by way of a loan with an initial maturity of more than one year from the Ontario Financing Authority the principal amount of \$374,698.00 (the "Loan") pursuant to a loan agreement in the form attached

hereto as Schedule "A" (the "Loan Agreement") which Loan Agreement constitutes an instrument prescribed under clause 247 (3) (f) of the *Education Act* and which sets out the terms and conditions on which the Ontario Financing Authority will make the Loan available to the Board;

# NOW THEREFORE THE LAKEHEAD DISTRICT SCHOOL BOARD ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Board hereby authorizes the Loan on the basis that it constitutes a loan under section 7 of the Regulation and authorizes the entering into of the Loan Agreement that is prescribed for the purposes of clause 247(3)(f) of the *Education Act*.
- 2. The Board is hereby authorized to enter into the Loan Agreement pursuant to which the Loan will be made available to the Board and the Chair of the Board and the Treasurer of the Board are hereby authorized to execute for and on behalf of the Board the Loan Agreement which provides for instalments of interest only and of combined (blended) principal and interest as hereinafter set forth, substantially in the form of Schedule "A", with such changes thereto as may be suggested by the Ontario Financing Authority and as such authorized officials of the Board shall approve.
- 3. The Director of Education of the Board, the Treasurer of the Board and any other financial officer of the Board are hereby each individually authorized generally to do all things and execute all other documents, instruments and agreements in the name of the Board in order to give effect to the Loan Agreement.
- 4. The Loan shall be paid in instalments of interest only and of combined (blended) principal and interest over a 25 year amortization period on the specified dates set out in Schedule "B" to the Loan Agreement with the first interest only payment on May 15, 2015 and thereafter instalments of combined (blended) principal and interest to November 15, 2039 in each of the years during the currency of the Loan as set forth in such schedule with the final payment of combined (blended) principal and interest on March 9, 2040. The Loan shall bear interest at the rate of 2.993% on the outstanding principal amount owing thereunder from time to time from the date thereof, which interest shall be payable in arrears as part of the instalments of interest only and of combined (blended) principal and interest payable on such days in each year of the currency of the Loan as are set out in Schedule "B" to the Loan Agreement.
- 5. In accordance with the provisions of the *Education Act* and the regulations made thereunder, during the currency of the Loan, the Board shall provide in its estimates for each fiscal year for the setting aside out of its general revenue in the fiscal year the amount necessary to pay the principal and interest coming due on the Loan in the fiscal year and, on or before each due date in each such year, the Board shall pay out of its general revenue the principal and interest coming due on the Loan in the year. Such sums of principal and interest payable on the Loan shall be provided for in accordance with subsection 247(5) of the *Education Act*. Subject to the foregoing, on or before each due date in each year during the currency of the Loan, the Board shall pay out of its general revenue the amount necessary to pay the specific sums of principal and interest payable on the Loan shown for the respective year as set forth in Schedule "B" to the Loan Agreement; but such amount shall be paid out of the Board's general revenue only to the extent required after taking into account funds available from other sources.
- 6. Any amounts payable by the Board in respect of the Loan including interest on overdue principal and interest in respect of the Loan together with fees and other amounts payable by the

Board under the Loan Agreement, if applicable, shall be paid out of the Board's general revenue or any other available funds.

7. The proceeds of the Loan shall be used to finance the Eligible Expenditures, as defined in the Loan Agreement, in respect of the Eligible Projects on a long-term basis and for no other purpose except as permitted by the *Education Act* and the regulations made thereunder.
