- 1. Background
 - 1.1 On January 27, 2000, the minister of education announced the government's plans for improving the quality of Special Education programs and services in Ontario and for ensuring greater accountability in the area of Special Education.
 - 1.2 This year, boards have been requested to update the 2016-2017 Special Education Plan based on a checklist provided by the Ministry of Education. In addition, boards must submit the checklist and the Special Education Plan for the 2017-2018 school year. As per Regulation 464/97, school boards must continue to consult with their Special Education Advisory Committee.

2. <u>Situation</u>

4. <u>Presentations</u>

4.1. <u>Prevalent Medical Conditions Policy & Procedures</u> – Leslie Hynnes

Leslie Hynnes, Education Officer provided an overview of the Prevalent Medical Conditions Policy and Procedures. If approved, policy 6062 Anaphylaxis and Medical Emergency Management will be revoked and rolled into this new policy. The new Prevalent Medical Conditions Policy will become the overarching policy for medical conditions and will include Sabrina's Law, Ryan's Law, diabetes and seizures. Additionally, management plans will be developed for diabetes, asthma and anaphylaxis. Discussion ensued, and questions were addressed. A suggestion was made to include language in the policy that will address privacy. Constituent feedback is due by May 31, 2017.

4.2. <u>Special Needs Strategy Update</u> – Diane Walker

Diane Walker, Chief Executive Officer with Children's Centre Thunder Bay (CCTB) presented an update on the Special Needs Strategy including an overview of Coordinated Service Planning and Integrated Rehabilitation Services. 9.3. SEAC Membership Update

Colleen Kappel, Superintendent of Education, noted that Anishnawbe Mushkiki submitted an application for Jennifer Bean to become a member of SEAC. A report has been submitted to the Board of Directors requesting approval of this appointment.

9.4. <u>Section 23 Programs</u>

Colleen Kappel, Superintendent of Education, provided an update on Section 23 Programs. Currently LDSB in collaboration with CCTB runs three programs at the elementary. LDSB and CCTB has been meeting over the past couple of years to discuss funding shortages. To address these funding shortfalls, only one program will operate beginning in the fall of 2017. A proposal was submitted to the Ministry asking for approval of a model that would support children in their home schools. This model was approved, and funding for two teachers was granted.

ADVERTISING IN THE SCHOOLS POLICY

8014

1. <u>Rationale</u>

One of the goals of Lakehead District School Board is to prepare its students to be actively involved in community life. Consequently we strive, within limits, to have our schools reflect the community in which we live. Advertising is everywhere around us, and the community views the schools as an ideal location to promote their products or events or points of view. Therefore, there is a need to provide direction to the schools and to the community regarding what forms of advertising are permissible in the schools of Lakehead District School Board.

2. Policy

It is the policy of Lakehead District School Board to permit a limited amount of advertising in the schools as outlined in the guidelines.

3. <u>Guiding Principles</u>

- 3.1 Advertising for charities is permitted in the school with the approval of the principal.
- 3.2 Advertising of purely a commercial nature is not permitted in the schools.

Commercial sponsorship of an event, an ad in a school publication, or the purchase of equipment is permitted with the approval of the principal in consultation with the school superintendent.

3.3 Announcements of political meetings or controversial social issues are permitted at the discretion of the principal. Political advertising during a campaign is not permitted.

4. <u>Review</u>

This policy shall be reviewed in accordance with Policy Development and Review Policy 2010.
