#### TO THE CHAIR AND MEMBERS OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE – Public Session

## RE: <u>REPORT ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE 2019-2020 SUPERVISED ALTERNATIVE</u> <u>LEARNING COMMITTEE</u>

#### 1. <u>Background</u>

- 1.1 In accordance with the Education Act of Ontario Regulation 374/10, the Board shall establish a Supervised Alternative Learning (SAL) Committee.
- 1.2 The role of the SAL Committee is to accept and consider applications from parents/guardians of compulsory secondary school age children, who are at least 14 years of age, and who wish to be excused from either full-time or part-time attendance at school. Where such applications are approved, the SAL Committee, in consultation with a representative(s) from the student's home school and the student's parent/guardian, determines an alternative learning program directed towards the student's needs and interests.
- 1.3 During the 2019-2020 school year, members of the committee included:
  - Trustee Marg Arnone;
  - Trustee Sue Doughty-Smith (Alternate);
  - Superintendent of Education Michelle Probizanski;
  - Education Officer Jeff Upton; and
  - James Laughton, Lorna Hunda and Dianna Atkinson representing Youth Employment Services (YES) as external and alternate members.

## 2. <u>Situation</u>

2.1 During the 2019-2020 school year, four SAL meetings were held before the COVID-19 shutdown. During the four SAL meetings, 16 applications were considered. Fifteen applications were approved.

2.2 Five applications were received for 14 and 15 year old students (four females and one male). Eleven applications were received for 16 and 17 year old students (7 females and 4 males).

#### RE: SAFE AND ACCEPTING SCHOOLS COMMITTEE UPDATE

#### 1. <u>Background</u>

Ontario schools should be a place where everyone – children, students, staff, parents and the community – feels welcome, safe and respected. A safe, inclusive and accepting school environment is essential for student well-being and achievement. All school boards in Ontario must follow a number of safe and accepting schools policies.

Lakehead District School Board is committed to the success of every student and the importance of providing a welcoming, safe and inclusive school culture.

#### 2. <u>Situation</u>

To identify areas to improve and develop strategies to address safe learning environments and promote safe learning environments in the system for all students and staff. The scope of the committee provides advice and guidance to the superintendent of education responsible for Safe Schools, including but not limited to:

- Equity and Inclusion;
- Mental Health;
- Healthy Schools;
- Safe and Accepting Schools; and
- Accessibility.

The Safe and Accepting Schools Committee responds to the Board on request for advice and recommendations on matters that the Board may direct to the committee.

2.1 Safe Schools Committee

The current members of the committee are:

- Michelle Probizanski, Superintendent of Education;
- Dave Covello, Manager of Information Technology and Corporate Planning;

## 2.2 Key Actions

## 2.2.1 Facilities

Implementation of Fobs

Fob access for exterior doors has been implemented system wide. Interior door fob access has been piloted at Westgate Collegiate and Vocational Institute. The Safe Schools Committee is exploring the possibility of expanding interior door fob access to additional schools.

## 2.2.2 Processes and Practices

Review of Police/School Board Protocol

The Police/School Board Protocol was reviewed and updated. The protocol is a partnership between:

- Lakehead District School Board;
- Thunder Bay Catholic District School Board;
- Conseil Scolaire de District Catholique des Aurores Boréales;
- Thunder Bay Christian School;
- Dennis Franklin Cromarty High School;
- Matawa First Nation Education;
- Ontario Provincial Police; and
- Thunder Bay Police Services.

Emergency Evacuation and Emergency School Closure Policy

The 6010 Emergency Evacuation and Emergency School Closure policy was updated to reflect recent changes and learnings from emergency situations in schools.

Student Concussion Management Policy

Lakehead District School Board has recently updated the 8074 Student Concussion Management policy.

Health and Safety Training

Lakehead District School Board's online training system supports all staff. Each September, all staff are assigned Ryan's and Sabrina's Law, and all COVID 19 related Health and Safety are part of mandatory annual training. The online training also requires all new staff to take a course on concussions and review the Board's 8074 Student Concussion Management policy and procedures. All staff are trained on the most current legislation and provided the safest environment for students. All new staff receive the following training:

- Online Incident Reporting Instructions;
- Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities (AODA) for Educators;
- Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act;
- Concussion Awareness;
- Lakehead District School Board 8074 Student Concussion Management policy;
- Sabrina's Law Life Threatening Allergies;
- Ryan's Law Asthma Awareness;
- Worker Health and Safety Awareness;
- Workplace Violence;
- Blood Born Pathogen Handling SSP staff only; and
- COVID 19 Training.
  - LPS COVID 19 Building Access and PPE Use;
  - WHMIS 2015;
  - Lakehead District School Board Health and Safety Protocols for COVID 19 – either provided in person by principal or online; and
  - Joint Health and Safety Committee Training COVID 19 (1.5 hours) Health and Safety Committee Members only.
- 2.2.3 School Supports and Initiatives

White Ribbon Campaign – Anti-Violence Education

Fifty boys in Grades 7 to 10 participated in a full day workshop, Engaging Male Students to Reduce and Prevent Gender-Based Violence. Workshop topics included:

- Human Rights and Equity;
- Masculinity and Respect;
- Resolving Anger Issues in Relationships;
- Gender Issues in the Workplace;
- Kizhaay Anishinaabe Niin: I Am A Kind Man;
- Healthy Relationships;
- Messages in the Music: Media and Social Media; and
- School Planning developing an anti-violence campaign in the schools. Schools are supported centrally as requested.

**Respect Initiative** 

Lakehead District School Board is a full community partner and is active in many aspects of the Respect campaign. An example of this initiative is our Everyone Matter's Day workshop. Bullying Prevention and Intervention

A new template was created and is to be used by all schools for consistency. Input for this new plan was collected and every two years a survey is done for school climates which will be used to inform this plan.

Safe Schools Binder

The Safe Schools binder was updated and distributed to all Lakehead District School Board schools. It provides principals with a place to include all pertinent information regarding health and safety.

Equity and Inclusive Education

The Equity and Inclusive Education Advisory Committee met twice during the 2019-2020 school year. Activities will be reported in a separate report to the Board.

#### 3. <u>Next Steps</u>

- 3.1 There will be a continued roll out of improved access to schools with the expansion of fob access to interior doors.
- 3.2 Keeping Students in School Pilot Project

This project aims to support schools in promoting positive measures to support students at risk of suspension. The Board team at Westgate Collegiate and Vocational Institute will continue the work during this school year.

Suspensions

The Ministry has made regulatory changes that impact how student behavior is addressed in Junior Kindergarten to Grade 3. Principals are no longer able to suspend students in JK to Grade 3 for discretionary reasons. They are now required to conduct an investigation respecting the allegations before imposing a mandatory suspension on a student in JK to Grade 3.

#### 4.. Conclusion

Lakehead District School Board continues to promote and foster safe learning environments for students, staff and community members through a variety of initiatives, on-going supports and resources, and community partner collaboration.
