TO THE CHAIR AND MEMBERS OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE— Public Session

RE: ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS

1. <u>Background</u>

- 1.1. Lakehead District School Board (LDSB), in its Strategic and Operational Plans, identifies the commitment to high levels of personal and academic excellence for every student, as well as a continued commitment to student success, by providing individualized programs and support for English Language Learners (ELL) through a cross-curricular approach to learning English.
- 1.2. Lakehead District School Board ensures students are contributing members of the school community. This commitment supports the development of a positive attitude towards learning and a student's belief in themselves for all ELL by ensuring there is a safe, welcoming school and classroom culture where ELL feel valued, trusted, and are an integral part of the school community.
- 1.3. Lakehead District School Board encourages effective and ongoing communication with families and acceptance of their diverse cultural backgrounds by embracing and celebrating each through the development of strong community relationships.
- 1.4. English Language Learners are newcomers to Canada whose first language is a language other than English or is a variety of English that is different from the variety used for instruction, and who may require supports to assist them in attaining proficiency in English. The increasing number of ELL in Ontario schools, including those in LDSB, presents an array of challenges and opportunities to educators.

2. Situation

2.1. In order to support strategic planning, quality assessment, programming, evaluation and communication, LDSB continues to employ both elementary and secondary itinerant teachers of ELL who support newcomer students. In response to the number of newcomers, as well as a renewed commitment to supporting ELL in partnership with the Elementary Teachers Federation of Ontario (ETFO), we have increased from 2.5 school based elementary teachers of ELL to 3.0 elementary itinerant teachers of ELL. At the secondary level, we continue to have 1.33 secondary itinerant teachers of ELL.

- 2.2. Lakehead District School Board is committed to responding to and supporting the ongoing needs of staff, ELL, and their families. An ELL team, consisting of the program department principal, elementary resource teacher and both elementary and secondary teachers of ELL, continues to work together to identify the current system needs regarding support for ELL, and their families, and to plan in response to those needs.
- 2.3. The Ministry of Education has provided professional development opportunities for teachers of ELL and the elementary resource teacher related to effective supports for ELL in virtual learning environments through a series of remote learning webinars in response to the pandemic. Board leads have also had the opportunity to participate in professional learning related to the implementation of the English Language Learners Policies and Procedures for Ontario Elementary and Secondary Schools, Kindergarten to Grade 12.
- 2.4. Lakehead District School Board continues to implement a consistent intake and orientation process that will allow for successful integration of all ELL and their families into our school communities. With a shift to online registration and remote learning, we have started to adapt this intake and orientation process to respond to the changes in our situation.
- 2.5. Through the continued use of the *Steps to English Proficiency* (STEP) framework, students are provided with individualized programs that are responsive to their level of English proficiency. Teachers of ELL support classroom teachers to make accommodations and/or modifications for those who require them based on their level of language acquisition. A system process is in place to document modifications for students who do require them.
- 2.6. The Ministry of Education, through a proposal application process, provided funding in the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 school year to:
 - support ELL through multi-level leadership (school and system leads) by working towards developing a more whole school and Board approach;
 - support the development of a protocol for identifying ELL with suspected special education needs;
 - provide targeted intervention to ELL who have suspected special education needs: and
 - provide elementary ELL with the opportunity to participate in summer learning programs to allow them to receive additional language supports
- 2.7. English Language Learners are provided with access to technology that will allow them to make use of translation supports and learning applications that will help support English language acquisition, development of literacy and numeracy skills, and access to content in other areas of the curriculum.
- 2.8. In partnership with Lakehead Adult Education Centre, LDSB was able to offer Secondary ELL with an opportunity to receive additional language supports outside the school day.
- 2.9. We continue to expand and strengthen partnerships by working with community partners like the Thunder Bay Multicultural Association and other community organizations to enhance transitions for newcomer students into elementary and secondary schools and the broader community.

2.10. English Language Learners in LDSB have opportunities to participate in school and community events where they can celebrate their own culture as well as experience Canadian culture.

Next Steps

- 3.1. Ongoing school based professional learning and support will be provided for classroom teachers of ELL to plan for and meet their unique needs through conversations and staff meetings.
- 3.2. Lakehead District School Board will pursue the development and/or use of a student information management and tracking system that will make initial and ongoing STEP information accessible to all schools and make it easier to identify and track ELL through the use of STEP. This will help in making informed programming decisions and will help to identify when ELL may require additional intervention and support.
- 3.3. We will continue to provide ELL at the very early stages of English language acquisition with technology that will help support them with their transition to school in Ontario.
- 3.4. Lakehead District School Board will continue to work in partnership with the Lakehead Adult Education Centre to provide additional language supports for secondary ELL.
- 3.5. The English Language Learners team will work in partnership with the special education department to finalize a Special Education protocol for ELL who have suspected special learning needs.
- 3.6. Programs that are in place to support ELL will be promoted by developing an ELL link on the Board website.
- 3.7. Lakehead District School Board will ensure that a section is included in the LDSB Improvement Plan that addresses the needs of ELL.
- 3.8. Lakehead District School Board, including the ELL team, will engage in a review of the implementation of the ELL, ESL, and ELD Programs and Services Policies and Procedures for Ontario Elementary and Secondary Schools, K-12 to analyze which areas of the policy are consistently operationalized, and which need further attention.

4. <u>Conclusion</u>:

Through input from staff, families and community stakeholders, we will build on our understanding of the unique needs of our ELL and this will enable us to revise programs and services as necessary in order to respond in a timely and precise manner to meet these needs. This will support us in reaching our goal of being committed to reducing gaps in performance and supporting ELL so that they are able to achieve high levels of academic performance. Lakehead District School Board is committed to ensuring a safe and welcoming environment for our ELL, and their families, to ensure they achieve this success.

Michelle Blackburn, George Jeffrey Children's Centre, suggested reviewing the SEAC Committee presentation to schools to be in line with the video once it is released.

8.2 SEAC Presentations to School Councils Update

Superintendent of Education, Michelle Probizanski, has reminded administrators to contact Christine Jones, Executive Secretary, if they would like to receive a SEAC presentation. Christine Jones, Executive Secretary, will provide an update at the next meeting if future requests are received. School videos are available to be viewed through Facebook and other platforms of social media of Lakehead Public Schools. Secondary schools have also created a quick one-minute video for students entering Grade 9. Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten students will be able to contact their school for personal tours if there is a need.

8.3 Asymptomatic Testing

Superintendent of Business, Kirsti Alaksa, confirmed that Lakehead District School Board (LDSB) will be offering asymptomatic testing in one or two schools, per week, in the near future. Lakehead District School Board is currently working with the Thunder Bay District Health Unit and the Thunder Bay Catholic District School Board and hope to have some communication out once students are back to in-person learning. Asymptomatic testing is currently only for LDSB students, staff, children at daycare within LDSB and their staff, and school bus drivers. Both PCR and rapid testing will be provided by appointment only, in 30-minute time slots.

All questions were addressed.

9. Correspondence

Michelle Probizanski, Superintendent of Education, reminded everyone of the correspondence received this month:

10. New Business

10.1 SEAC Scholarship Award

Superintendent of Education, Michelle Probizanski, reminded the committee of the in-school SEAC Scholarship Award of \$100, which was created in 2020, and is available to students this year who are enrolling into post-secondary education. Liz Tod, Learning Disabilities Association of Ontario, also reminded the committee that if no one has applied for the in-school scholarship, then the guidance counselor and/or staff would identify a student to receive this award.

10.2 Lakehead District School Board COVID-19 Update

Michelle Probizanski, Superintendent of Education, provided a COVID-19 update to the committee. The University of Ottawa received a variety of documents from LDSB and is hopeful a Best Practices document will be issued soon. Appreciation was extended to Lori Carson, Special Education Officer, Ruth Ann Fay, Special Education Resource Teacher and Anne-Marie McMahon-Dupuis, System Principal, for their assistance in getting that completed. Starting March 15, 2021, LDSB's virtual learning will be extended for an additional two weeks. Lakehead District School Board currently has eight special needs students doing face to face learning, in the mornings, at Algonquin Avenue Public School. Day treatment is also running face to face, in the mornings only. All schools are currently open and school closures can only come from the Ministry. Parents who feel they may need their children to attend face to face, should contact their school principal, a superintendent or special education officer to discuss further.

All questions were addressed.

11. Information/Inquires & Association Reports

- Liz Tod, Learning Disabilities Association of Ontario, provided the committee with information from the Bright and Quirky website. This site is currently providing talks from people around the world. Liz Tod will be watching these free talks. School boards are provided access passes with a membership. Christine Jones, Executive Secretary, sent an email with the link for members for their convenience.
- Anne Antenucci, Autism Ontario, Thunder Bay & District, informed members that she also currently sits on the City of Thunder Bay's Accessibility Advisory Committee, who are reviewing their Junior Inclusion services. Anybody that is interested in providing feedback were asked to email her with any committee input.

12. SEAC Budget Update

Michelle Probizanski, Superintendent of Education, provided the committee with an updated March 2021 SEAC budget. The SEAC video will be coming out of a different budget, not SEAC's.
