Lakehead Public Schools is piloting a program that is geared to assist parent/guardians of Aboriginal students and staff of elementary and secondary schools. The purpose is to nurture relationships, bring collaboration and provide support.

Some areas of support could include:

- Assistance with student registration
- Navigation of the educational system
- Translation
- Transition to school
- Connection to community supports
- Assistance with school event visits and participation
- Parent/Teacher interviews and meetings

Parents play the first and most important role in their children's education and are key partners in building a quality education system.

Parental involvement in education takes many forms and can contribute to their child's success by helping their children with homework, asking them about their day, communicating with their teachers and providing guidance and support for their child.

Parents can become involved in education through various Lakehead Public Schools' school community groups such as School Council, Special Education Advisory Committee, Aboriginal Education Advisory Committee, or by performing other volunteer roles within the school or board.

Lakehead Public Schools recognizes the principle of advocacy by providing parents and guardians an opportunity to access an advocate if they wish to utilize one for additional supports. An advocate can be seen as a support person, helper, friend and/or interpreter.
