#### **Aboriginal Studies**

The Native languages program offers students the opportunity to develop a functional command of a Native language, which can be expanded through further study or through contact with other speakers of the language. Students become familiar with the writing and sound systems of the language under study, and develop an appreciation of Native language and culture.

Native Studies provides a broad range of knowledge related to Aboriginal peoples where students increase their awareness and understanding of the history, cultures, world views, and contributions of Aboriginal peoples in Canada.

#### Alternative Programs

Our alternative programs provide the individualized attention and variety that students need to experience success. Our programs combine a variety of intake points, flexible timetables, and tailored instructional methods to reach every student.

#### Arts

The opportunity to express yourself through visual arts, dramatic arts and musical arts is available at all schools.

#### Co-Curricular Clubs, Activities and Teams

#### **Cooperative Education**

Students at all schools enjoy health and physical education courses as well as many opportunities for extracurricular experiences and activities that promote healthy, active and involved choices.

#### Science, Math & Social Sciences

All Lakehead Public High Schools offer science, mathematics and social science courses that allow students to commit to a career path and fully prepare students for life after high school.

#### Student Services, Guidance **Counsellors and Social Workers**

Services of trained guidance counsellors, social workers, attendance counsellors and educational professionals are available to all students. All students are welcome to access these caring adults for assistance, academic planning and personal well being.

#### Trade and Technology Programs

A wide range of trade and technology programs are offered at all Lakehead Public High Schools. Each campus provides opportunities for study in Communication, Construction, Manufacturing, Transportation and Computer Technology. Students explore the skilled trades through cooperative education placements, skills competitions and career fairs

# Checklist

- Proof of your age
  - · a birth certificate or status card
- ☐ Health Card
- Non-Residency
  - If your parent/legal guardian is living on a reserve, a non-resident tuition form needs to be completed. This form is available from our schools.
- Custodial Care (Legal Guardianship)

A Custodial Care agreement can be used to appoint a temporary guardian for your child who will have authority to: 1) have custody of your child; and 2) make necessary decisions (medical, school and recreational) for your child in your absence. This form is an affidavit, which means it must be signed in front of a notary public (lawyer), who will attest to your identity and verify your signature. If you have any handwritten changes or additions, each must have your initial before you have the affidavit notarized stamp/seal) by the notary public (lawyer).

- ☐ Residential Contact Information
  - You will need to bring the contact address and telephone number of where you will be staying while at school.
- ☐ Your Learning History
  - Official transcript, or
  - Credit counselling summary, or
  - ☐ Grade 8 Report Card
- When to register?

Whenever possible, early registration is important to ensure student course requests can be met.

Courses are offered based on student enrolment.
