Lakehead Public Schools and Confederation College offer this secondary program emphasizes communication, literacy and planning for the future.

Students work on compulsory and elective credits. Much of the work is completed independently while teachers are present for support and guidance. Students work towards their Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD). Students can earn up to 4 dual credits. Dual credits are college classes that students receive both a college credit and a high school credit upon successful completion.

## Who can attend?

The **collegelink** program is designed to bring students into a college environment.

The **collegelink** student should have completed a minimum of 20 high school credits to enrol.

## Why attend?

**collegelink** is for students who have a college destination in mind even though they have opted out of the traditional high school system.

September - June each weekday

## How long?

Students attend until they have completed all of the requirements of the OSSD.

## What next?

Enroll in a Confederation College Program (if they have completed their OSSD or have successfully completed the College's Mature Student Evaluation);  
Attend the Lakehead Adult Education Centre;  
Return to a traditional high school; or,  
Enter the world of work.
